Congratulations on securing a place on our **Outdoor Education** course at BCA. We look forward to working with you, developing your skills and preparing you for your future career.

As a new Outdoor Education student at BCA, or a returning student on a new course, there will be some costs associated with your study programme that you need to be aware of. Some of these costs are compulsory while others are optional, but would enhance your experience at BCA.

Uniform/Kit/PPE requirements & where/how to order

All Outdoor Education students will be required to purchase the compulsory BCA kit, which is appropriate to their programme. We try to keep all compulsory kit bundles to a minimum cost and then give the option for you to purchase additional items. Clean, practical kit must be brought in every day.

<u>Please refer to the size guide and ensure that the sizes you order are correct. Once the kit has</u> been personalised with the BCA logo, refunds/exchanges will not be permitted.

In addition to the compulsory bundle, all Outdoor Education students are required to have a suitable pair of approach shoes or walking boots, a pair of walking trousers, a waterproof coat and waterproof trousers for expedition.

For water based lessons, a water sports kit suitable for use all year round will be needed.

Returning students are very welcome to order another complete bundle, however, you will already have some kit from last year, so you may decide just to order a few additional items. On days when you are not wearing a college uniform, students are expected to dress in a professional and appropriate manner, in line with the college dress code. This includes no revealing clothing e.g. crop tops, sports bras, vest tops or cycling shorts. Only black leggings will be allowed.



All students will be required to bring appropriate stationery and a notebook to all lessons. We advise students to purchase a ring binder folder to keep class notes and resources in, for future reference. BCA <u>does not</u> supply pens, pencils, rulers or notepads.

Health & Safety information e.g. no piercings, hair tied back etc

During practical lessons, long hair will need to be tied back and piercings/jewellery to be removed or covered for safety reasons. Chewing gum is not permitted in lessons.

Additional qualifications (where applicable) e.g. BHS / First Aid / Refereeing quals etc

Outdoor Education students may have the opportunity to complete additional qualifications as part of their study programme. The training for these qualifications will form part of the course syllabus, however, the actual exam will be optional and will incur an additional cost. We will notify you of any details relating to these courses as and when necessary.

Membership to Governing bodies is compulsory for those students wanting to pursue industry recognised qualifications. More information on this will be provided by course tutors in the lead up to qualification assessments.

Industry Placement

As part of your study program, you will be required to carry out a mandatory industry placement. This will give you the opportunity to experience a working week in a relevant role in the industry. <u>It's never too soon to start looking for your placement!</u> Provisional dates for your placement are detailed below:-

We actively encourage students to find their own industry placement near to home, but BCA will support you, if required. All employers accepting industry placement students will be visited beforehand to ensure that they comply with health and safety regulations and also have the correct insurance cover in place. All placements must be confirmed by the closing date stated, and failing to complete a placement may result in you being unable to complete your qualification.

Student expectations (Code of Conduct)



The expectation for all students is to conduct themselves in a manner that allows a respectful environment. All students will be required to read and sign the departmental specific Code of Conduct. We will go through this to ensure that our values are clear and can be adhered to at all times. This will also include arriving promptly for the start time of your lessons.

Locker Hire

The cost is £10.00 for the year. At the end of the year you will be required to return the key and ensure that the locker is clean, tidy & not damaged. Payable via PayMyStudent.

<u>Trips</u>

All Level 1 Sport, PS and OE students are required to pay £50.00 which will contribute towards the cost of the compulsory trips that you will participate in as part of your course.

All Level 2, Level 3, Year 1 & 2 Outdoor Education students are required to pay £250.00. This will contribute towards the cost of the compulsory trips/expeditions that you will participate in as part of your course. This payment will need to be made during the enrolment process.
