How to Apply

Your Step-by-step Guide to Studying at Slough & Langley

Step 1: Choose Your Course

We offer a wide range of courses at all levels – if you're still not sure, give us a call on 01753 793288 or email admissions@windsor-forest.ac.uk for independent advice.

Step 2: Apply

Apply online at www.slough.ac.uk/study/
You shall receive an email to confirm we have received your application.

Step 3: Attend Your Interview

You will be invited to book an interview, where you will discuss your course choice and plans for the future. This will also give you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have too.

Step 4: Offer

Following a successful interview, you shall be made a conditional offer via email.

Please note: This can take up to 14 days. To accept your conditional offer, please log back into your Student Portal. You need to accept your offer to receive your invitation to enrolment.

Step 5: Enrol

You shall be sent steps on how to enrol onto your chosen course the Summer before you start with us and you will need your exam results to be able to enrol in August. If your results are better than expected or you didn't do as well as you hoped, please do not worry, we can find a suitable alternative for you.

Step 6: Start College

We look forward to welcoming you in September!

Study Programme

Our study programmes combine your chosen subject with a range of transferable skills to enhance your learning and help you develop. We will equip you with the skills and knowledge required for progression on to university, apprenticeships or employment.

English & Maths

Development of English and maths skills is essential for successful progression. We will support you to ensure you leave us having achieved the best grades you possibly can. You will be timetabled into a class that is the right level for you based on your grades and prior experience. All students will be working towards attaining a grade 4 or above at GCSE.

Already Achieved a Grade 4 or Above at GCSE?

You will not be required to study additional English and/or maths.

Achieved a Grade 3 at GCSE?

You will be enrolled onto a GCSE course and will work towards gaining a grade 4 or above as part of your study programme.

Achieved Lower Than a Grade 3 at GCSE?

You will be enrolled onto a GCSE course or another suitable English and/or maths qualification at an appropriate level.

Practical Lessons, Lectures & Tutorials

These planned activities take place on our extensive campus and will help you develop your independent study skills. You will focus on extending your practical skills and knowledge to gain a strong understanding of your chosen subject area.

Personal & Professional Development

Employer links are important and help you focus on gaining skills you need for your future career. Your study programme may include visits from industry professionals or trips to business venues and workplaces. College life will also help you develop the skills required to be successful in your chosen career. Good punctuality, attendance and commitment to your study programme is an expectation.

Qualifications Offered

T Levels are equivalent to 3 A Levels and offer a broad understanding of sector-specific issues and occupational specialisms. There is a significant work experience element to a T Level programme that supports the classroom based learning.

BTECs are career-focused qualifications assessed mainly through coursework and practical tasks. They prepare students for university, apprenticeships, or employment in specific industries.

Apprenticeships are suitable for those who have a clear career path, are at least 16 years old, and want to earn a wage while learning.

Higher Education

A foundation degree is a two-year higher education qualification combining academic study with workplace skills. It's often assessed through coursework and can lead to a full honours degree or skilled employment.

From a Foundation degree to a full BA (Hons), our courses enable you to develop the skills to progress in your career working with children, alongside your job.

Apprenticeships

Gain real work experience, develop your professional skills and get the training you need to secure a successful future in employment.

What is an Apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a job with training to industry standards. An apprentice is a paid employee who is training on the job and involved in an educational programme.

The apprentice gains the skills, knowledge and behaviours that they need to forge their career. This programme supports businesses to train the future workforce. An apprentice could be someone new to the industry or could be an existing member of staff.

As an Apprentice You Will

- Work alongside experienced staff
- Earn a wage and get holiday pay
- Gain job-specific skills
- Get time for study related to your role

You are required to stay in education, employment or training until you turn 18 but this can include being an apprentice. Apprenticeships have a functional skills requirement in English and maths but learners who already have obtained the level required will be exempt from undertaking them. An apprenticeship is a real job where you will be employed full-time for the duration of your qualification. Apprenticeships also include an end-point assessment. It's an assessment at the end of your apprenticeship to make sure you're fully competent in your specific occupation.
